Freemen's Common – Student Village

University of Leicester has submitted the final version of its planning application to demolish the existing student accommodation known as Freemen's Common Houses and replace these with a new development called Freemen's Common Student Village.

Friends of Clarendon Park responded to the University's initial consultation in 2017 and has been providing regular progress updates at our quarterly members meetings.

This is a major development project, right next to **Clarendon Park**, and is likely to have wide-reaching implications for everyone in our community.

The publicity period for this application ends on Tuesday 26th February 2019 and **Leicester City Council** have indicated that the application is likely to be determined by the Planning and Development Control Committee on Wednesday 13th March 2019.
